For the loss of Ion Sayas

John (Ion) Sayas held the crucial post of the Deputy Ombudsman responsible for environmental and quality of life issues, since 2011.

He studied Development Economics and Urban and Regional Planning at the London School of Economics and obtained a PhD from of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning, School of Architecture of the National Technical University of Athens.

From 1998 to 2004 he worked as a Researcher at the Institute of Urban and Regional Sociology of the Greek National Centre for Social research. Since 2004 he had been a member of the academic staff at the Department of Geography and Regional Planning, School of Rural and Surveying Engineering of the National Technical University of Athens, where he taught at a graduate and post graduate level.

He has been scientific director and principal investigator in many research projects dealing with the spatial and socio-economic impacts of development at urban and regional level.

Ion Sayas has been very dear to all of us who had the honor to know him and work with him. We are devastated for his loss.

Statement of the Greek Ombudsman, Andreas Pottakis

Professor Ioannis (Ion) Sayas took up the position of the Deputy Ombudsman responsible for the quality of life in 2011.
